Learning Spaces for Living Well for Forest Grove School #5

I live on well-traveled Forest Grove Road in Scott County, Iowa, Pleasant Valley Township. My early white paint weathered to gray and is white again. Now I stand proud on the high, fertile prairie with my well-rung bell polished and poised inside my bell tower to sound the call from this one-room country school turned educational museum.

After a recess of many decades, it's time to show my new concrete block foundation and poured basement, my new front door, my three new windows on each side and two in front, my new chimney, and my new cedar shake shingles. I am familiar as an old oak tree waving its brightest leaves in the breeze and spreading its strongest roots deep into the Midwestern soil.

My growing health shows in remembered spaces. My round ceiling curves with aesthetics again as does the outside curved cover over the capital letters of my name.

I remember a kerosene fixture provided light, and a big, barrel-shaped, black coal furnace spread heat. In the morning, students set their potatoes on top so they'd be ready by lunch.

Good, solid teaching does things to students and potatoes. No fast dip in temperature or serious drop in content inside these walls. Reading, writing, arithmetic and spelling remain staples, while additions include geography, history, music, grammar, hygiene,

agriculture, civics and industry, all valuable lessons that changed lifelong learning to well-done.

Sledding in winter excited recess as did the Great Stride in the fall and spring when my students became airborne ten feet high on centrifugal force as they grasped chains hanging from a pole and ran faster and faster around it to take wing.



More rehabilitated than original, I am still an old-fashioned American who wants to start school reciting The Pledge of Allegiance, singing The Star-Spangled Banner and hearing civil tongues throughout the day as my teacher teaches, and my older students help younger ones so everyone here can grow and perform well in this life with a positive report card ✓ far exceeds all requirements.
