Joseph M. Antunovich, AIA, is the Founder and President of Antunovich Associates, a 90-person architectural, planning and interior design firm with offices in Chicago and Washington,

D.C. Since moving to Chicago in 1974, Joe has demonstrated expertise in "new urbanist" mixed-use villages, corporate and residential campuses, retail facilities, historic preservation projects, and university master planning. Joe's clients are vast from corporations like McDonald's to institutions including the John G. Shedd Aquarium, DePaul University, Harvard, Yale, Columbia, and the University of Chicago. Joe has worked most tirelessly on the preservation of historic buildings, including the rehabilitation of the Reliance Building to the Burnham Hotel, the former Goldblatt's Department Store on State Street for DePaul's Loop campus, and the Ransom Cable Mansion for the headquarters of the Driehaus Securities Corporation.
